Supporting Wider Achievement Opportunities for All	 Offer a variety of clubs and activities in school all without charge. Celebrate achievements in all areas. Offer leadership opportunities open to all senior learners
Promote Attendance to ensure all learners have their entitlement to education	 Promote the importance of regular attendance. Work in partnership with families to remove any barriers to learning (PEF lead and PSW) Short focused months with intensive support
Development of the role of Play as a learning tool across the whole school	 Introduce play based learning opportunities across the school. Invest in high-quality resources such as Blocks and Kapla Development role to offer training and planning time for staff to embed play
Raise engagement through high quality Teaching and Learning opportunities	Staff training opportunities to support improved outcomes for all learners by fostering higher levels of engagement and active participation, evidenced through learner feedback
Continue to offer Family Learning opportunities for parents and carers to join us in school	 Fund additional PSWs to deliver a comprehensive family learning programme and targeted interventions to remove barriers for families to support their engagement in family learning. Create opportunities for parents/carers to engage with their child(ren)'s learning in school. Run workshops with practical take aways about how parents can help support at home
Increase the numbers of learners self-reporting positively in Health and Wellbeing check ins	 PSW trained to embed H&WB interventions universally and support targeted learners through a range of small group settings. Bespoke targeted small group settings for identified learners
Offer subsidised Healthy Snack in classes each day	Provide a healthy and subsidised snack to allow all learners to have snack time together
