A local authority subsidised bus operates for children out with walking distance. After school clubs are run in school where there is no need to travel any distance. We have a bike and scooter parking area at the back of the school for pupils to access. | School Staff can support those requiring assistance to complete transport applications. | |
| Friendships at School | Uniform is promoted to negate any peer pressure for branded and fashion clothing. All pupils have access to digital technology in school. We teach the importance of our relationships and challenging discrimination through our Health and Wellbeing curriculum.
